

Sorry if this sounds harsh but we have had members book but not pay, Lisa has put them on the rally list in good faith and they haven't turned up. This not only has taken a lesson place that someone else could have taken but we then have run the day at a greater loss due to no fees for that lesson.

Please also adhere the the rally booking CLOSURE DATE. This is in place so that Lisa has optimal time to organise groups. The date will be strictly adhered to by Lisa, no excuses, as she usually gives us plenty of time to book and pay. Rally dates are published far in advance for members to put in diaries/calendars/phones etc.

Booking fees are non refundable unless for sickness in either horse or human. No other excuses accepted. (You may need to pray for nice weather if you don't like rain).




NOVEMBER RALLIES

Hello everyone,

A few weeks ago Susie and I had the pleasure of a short break at a beautiful horse facility up on the Murray, near Howlong on the NSW border.

It's hard to describe Banyandah in words, as its one of those places where you softly melt into the nature around you, and lose track of time, work or worries.

A weekend is simply not long enough. The attraction is with many things - the 350 acres of river flats, the magnificent huge red gum trees, the safe trails along the river, the quality and style of all that is built there, the peace and tranquillity, and of course the amazing horse facilities, including arenas, round yards, large horse yards, and an extensive permanent outdoor horse playground, cross country course and horse swimming beach on the river. Yet with all this, it's reasonably priced as it's designed specifically for horse clinics and relaxing time away with your horse.

It's a superb property with something for everyone, from nervous riders to experienced. It is a place to spend high quality time with your horse and friends, or just sitting in the grass watching time pass by with the current.

Susie and I had a fabulous time meandering around the property on horseback and on foot, playing with the obstacles, and in the honeycomb, moving a few cows around the "Field of Dreams", watching the Cow Working Clinic that was on at the time and playing at liberty with the ponies. picnicking on a blanket by the river, sitting under the stars by the fire, burning marshmallows and philosophising on the meaning of life with horses ③. The opportunities are many and varied as the property lends itself to so many things. You could come up and use the facilities in your own way or join in group activities.

The idea of having a club camp there with our members is something to consider for next year, in spring or autumn. So we have put the rates and accom details here for you to look at. Also see the website link above.

Banyandah - Rates & Accommodation

There is detailed info on the website, but here is a snapshot of the current costs and accommodation arrangements. As it's a popular venue we would need to make an advanced booking in order to secure the venue for our members.

Camping is \$15 per night per person with the use of a cattleman's hut for cooking, showers and toilet.

Accommodation in the "Lighthouse" is \$50 per night per person and sleeps 8 people in 4 bedrooms with very comfortable bunks. Doonas and pillows are provided, but BYO sheets. The lighthouse has fully equipped large kitchen, wood fire, and two bathrooms.

Horse Yard hire is \$15 per day. At certain times of the year the horses will be allowed into a large common paddock to graze together.

Possibilities are there to bring the family, particularly for camping.

We are considering a return visit in autumn, for 3 or 5 days, possible dates: Easter 2016 25th – 29th March. If you are interested in these or some other dates, email Anna on annagust37@hotmail.com I would like feedback on whether you would be interested in going to Banyandah as a social event, to do a clinic or not at all.



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
